#### Fine Gardening vs. Conventional Landscaping



#### 1. Minimal Threshold of Care

This is the minimum threshold of care that your landscape needs to thrive. After years of Fine Gardening, we know these steps are critical and cannot be skipped if you want to maintain the beauty of your landscape and protect your investment. Just like any other areas of your home, your landscape needs regular care. It is a living, evolving ecosystem. Keep in mind that Minimal Threshold Care is in addition to your Basic Landscape Management, such as turf fertilization and leaf removal. The combination of both ensure a truly thriving landscape.

#### Baseline Care Items:

- Spring Wake-up: Helps the landscape transition from a dormant state to a growing state. Edge and define beds, cut back and removal of any plant material left from winter, tend to any winter damage, unwrap any protected plants, and mulching of beds. Ensure the entire landscape is ready for the growing season.
- Herbaceous Plant & Bed Management: Tending to all of the soft plants (perennials, annuals, tropcals, bulbs, and groundcover) as needed throughout the growing season using best Horticulture (Plant Care) Practice. Tending to the ecosystem as a whole and keeping purposefully open spaces free from unwanted weeds, volunteers and invasives.



#### 2. Enhanced Care

Enhancing your landscape with added efforts and additional care can greatly increase the beauty of your landscape along with your personal satisfaction with it. These are choices you may want to make annually, specifically when you want cerain enrichments, or added in as necessary for the plants or ecosystem.

Planting seasonal annuals on a yearly basis can enhance the color in your landscape, and keep it fresh and exciting from year to year. They help us celebrate the seasons and add to a landscape in a way that shrubs and perennials don't have the ability to. They add an enhanced "wow" factor not seen in conventional landscapes.

#### Enhanced Care Items

- Garden Modifications: Small and incremental alterations that will enhance your landscape's overall health and performance.
  - Seasonal Color: Seasonal plantings of annuals, temperennials, tropicals, or bulbs (spring/summer/fall, and even winter) to give a blast of added interest, color, texture, and fragrance. They really ramp up that "WOW" factor. This is a great way to keep your garden interesting and purposefully refreshing season after season, year after year.



#### Enhanced Care Items Continued

- Winter & Holiday Décor: Dressing up your home with greens and holiday décor to brighten up the long winter months. Greens, lights, garlands, and other accessories add vibrance and cheer that brighten your home and garden during the bleak winter season.
- Rejuvenative Pruning: From time to time, ornamental trees and shrubs need what's referred to as a rejuvenative pruning. This is a vigorous pruning of old branches that allows new, vigorous branches to grow in their place. This can often breathe new life and performance into an under-perfoming shrub.
- Dividing/Transplanting/Removing: Some plants can become larger than their space allows, especially if they're thriving. When that happens, overcrowding becomes a problem. Division, transplanting (or in some cases removing) an herbaceous plant (perennial) or woody ornamental becomes necessary. That allows proper sizing of all plants in their respective plances. It promotes health, eliminates overcrowding, and allows you to enhance another area of your property.





#### 3. Special Projects

There are always opportunities to enhance your landscape. Nature is always evolving. There are frequently existing elements that can be enhanced or expanded on, just as there are times when creating a new element is the key. Looking at your landscape through a Fine Gardening eye keeps the potential for refinement as a way to help further enhance your enjoyment of your landscape. # **Essential Elements Of A Fine** Gardening Program.



#### Edging Beds

Edging beds involves cutting turf to create a distinct delineation between lawn and flower beds. This prevents turf roots from creeping into your flower beds and prevents any flowers (or especially ground cover) from creeping into the lawn. This keeps your beds neat and distinct. It draws your eye through the bed in a pleasing manner.

#### Pruning Woody Ornamentals

Not all shrubs can, or should be, pruned at the same time. It's important that each shrub get pruned in the proper stage of their growth cycle. Likewise, not all shrubs can be pruned in the same manner. Spring, Summer and Fall pruning needs are different. On occasion, we may recommend pruning in winter due to the exact circumstances of a plant. It's critical to know these horticultural differences in order to keep a beautiful, thriving landscape. Pruning woody ornamentals entails selecting specific branches and making precise cuts to ensure the overall shape, health, and beauty of a shrub.





#### **Herbaceous Plant Management**

Herbaceous plants are perennials, annuals, tropicals and bulbs. Gardens mature and age over time, and as that process continues, the needs of a garden change. A Fine Gardener must anticipate those needs and take appropriate measures to ensure the health, beauty, and longevity of your garden. There are seasonal fluctuations as well as fluctuations from year to year. Light trimming is necessary as these plants cycle through their season. From time to time a plant may need additional support so inconspicuous staking or tying is necessary. Flowers that are 50% or more past peak bloom should be removed (deadheading) to ensure beauty and prolong flowering. Sometimes if a plant is truly thriving, it can outgrow it's spot. It becomes too large for the area it's planted in, and overcrowding nearby plants. When this happens, it becomes necessary to divide, or even remove the plant to preserve the ecosystem as a whole.



#### Insect and Disease Management

From Aphids to Powdery Mildew, there are a lot of things to be wary of in the Landscape. An insect population or a disease can wipe out a landscape seemingly overnight. Fine Gardeners must be stewards of the environment. Not all bugs are bad, and an approach to careful management must be taken in order to preserve both the landscape as well as the environment.





#### General Weed Management

Mother Nature is an opportunist. If we're creating an area where plants can thrive, so also can weeds thrive. Weed barrier fabric does not work. Weeding is a necessary "evil" that cannot, and should not be overlooked. Pre-emergent helps, but weeds will still break through. Just like herbaceous plants, weeds have a growing and blooming cycle. It takes only one weed to produce hundreds of seeds that will create weeds for several years to come. Not only is Mother Nature an opportunist, she's also a master of camouflage. Weeds will most often grow amongst plants that have similar leaves. Keeping a sharp eye out is critical to weed management. Seeds are small and can take hold almost anywhere, including under leaves of desirable plants.

#### Watering Strategies

Proper hydration is a critical element in the health of any landscape. It allows the plant to absorb nutrients from the soil, derive support of their cells, and allows for proper respiration. A Fine Gardener monitors the water in a landscape. Automatic irrigation systems may not be enough to promote proper hydration in a landscape. Obstacles such as trees, fences, gates, and walls may block certain areas of the landscape from receiving the proper amount of water. During periods of excess heat or drought, supplemental water may be necessary. Likewise, an automatic irrigation system may provide too much water, leading to rot and decay. It's important to check your landscape regularly for proper hydration. If you do not have an automatic irrigation system, alternative watering strategies may be implemented to help support plant hydration.
